Have you ever used the what3words app? It's a brilliant way of precisely identifying locations across the UK with three random words - there's three words to identify exactly where you live!

What more can you discover about what3words?

After you've checked the what3words that have been allocated to your own home, try investigating more widely. Here's some suggestions:

Check out the what3words for:

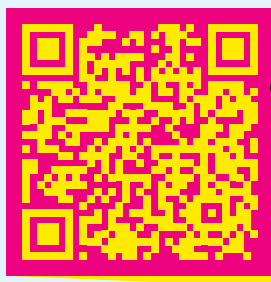
- Your school.
- The classroom.
- Your friend's home.
- The school playground.
- The local shop.
- Sports hall/gym.
- The Town Hall.
- Local hospital.
- Fire station.
- Police station.

Now that you're used to using the app, use it to investigate your area more widely. Can you discover the what3words for:

- An interesting local feature such as an old country house?
- An ancient monument or an extremely old structure such as a ruined fort or church?
- Any out of the ordinary buildings in your wider locality?
- The location of a historical event such as a famous battle or another event that made the news?

Every locality has something that makes it unique - can you discover what it is in your area?

We can travel freely again so, if you could choose anywhere in the world, where would you go?

### LESSON 2:

#### THE HEROIC QUEST OF THE VALIANT PRINCE IVANDOE

- What is it about travelling to somewhere new that excites us?
- Since restrictions were removed, which places have you visited?
- What would be your dream holiday destination for the summer?
- Why?

#### THE HEROIC QUEST OF THE VALIANT PRINCE IVANDOE

Share with the class what you know about Prince Ivandoe and his quest? For example:

- What led Prince Ivandoe and Bert to set off on their quest.
- One or two interesting, strange or mysterious places they discovered.
- Why do you think that Prince Ivandoe and Bert find themselves in weird and wonderful situations?
- Have you ever visited a place that was different to what you expected?
- Was it unexpectedly good - or unexpectedly bad?!
- How would you react if you met one of the following Prince Ivandoe characters, on holiday:
  - Princess Syllabob
  - Cupcake the Poodle
  - Troll Woman
  - King Axolotl
- Could you describe one of these characters to someone who hadn't met them?

Depending on the timing of the lesson, your teacher might decide to set you this extra challenge:

#### THE WHAT3WORDS CHALLENGE

- Select one of the places that Prince Ivandoe and Bert visit.
- Within that place, create a secure hiding place for Bert and Prince Ivandoe - just in case one of the creatures they encounter turns out to be less friendly than they'd hoped.

- Once you've created Prince Ivandoe and Bert's secure hiding place, make a small secret map of the location and the hiding place.
- Draw a what3words grid to cover the area.
- The what3words grid must have three words for every part of the map.
- Share a copy of the location (with the grid and words) with a rival pair or group.
- Don't reveal the location of the secret hiding place to your rival pair or group.
- Provide the rival team with clues to the location and challenge the rival team to 'unlock' the what3words title they'd made up earlier of the hiding place. (\*see below for details of how to manage the what3words challenge)

**\*More details about how the what3words challenge works.**

Create a what3words tag of your own to match the area you've identified as a safe haven. For example, the words they might have selected could be **chose.seat.fortunate**

Don't give these words to your rival group or pair. Disguise the three words and offer clues as to what the real what3 words tag is, e.g.

1. 'When I opened the box of chocolates I c---e the one in the purple wrapping. (5 letters)
2. 'I was able to get onto the bus but there wasn't a single free s--t' (4 letters)
3. 'The football came flying towards me. I randomly kicked it. Amazingly, the ball curved round and went straight into the goal! I was so f-----e' (9 letters)

Ask your teacher if you qualified for a sticker for your work this lesson on The Heroic Quest Of The Valiant Prince Ivandoe.

Managing to keep Prince Ivandoe and Bert's secret location secure, should help your chances!

### LESSON 3: TOWNS AND CITIES OF THE WORLD

#### Quiz time:

Your teacher might be about to challenge you with a travel and city-focused quiz...

Here are some warm-up questions:

- In the famous travel adventure story by Jules Verne, how many days was Phileas Fogg given to travel around the world? *(Choose one of the following: 2 weeks, 80 days, 2 years)*
- How many miles is it from Manchester to Torquay? *(Choose one of the following: 255 miles, 285 miles, 305 miles)*
- Using the mileage you've selected, can you calculate how long it normally takes to drive there? *(Choose one of the following: 3 hours, 3.30 mins, 4.30 mins)*
- How far is it from Birmingham to Sydney Australia? *(Choose one of the following: 9,600 miles, 10,250 miles, 10,588 miles)*
- Estimate to the nearest hour, how long the average flight would take. *(Choose one of the following: 22 hours, 24 hours, 3 days)*
- What's the distance in miles from London to Barcelona? *(Choose one of the following: 420 miles, 816 miles, 986 miles)*
- And how long do you think, a London to Barcelona flight would take? *(Choose one of the following: 1 hour, 2 hours, 2.30 mins)*

You might know quite a lot about the town or city you live in or near but, how much do you know of more distant places?

Check an atlas, a world map or classroom globe and choose a town or city you think might reveal some fascinating secrets.

What can you find out about it?

### A UNIQUE FACT

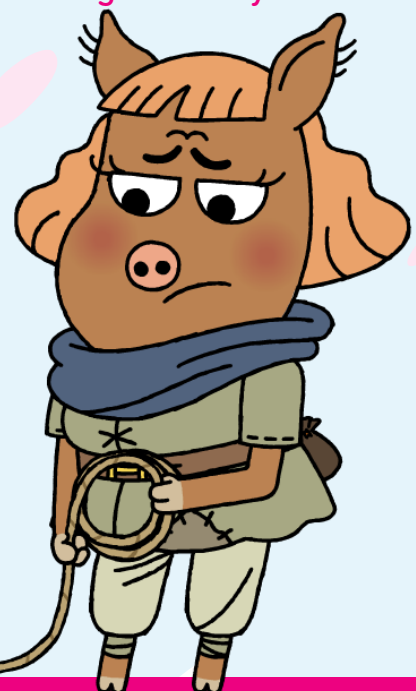
Most towns and cities have something special which sets them apart: try to discover a unique feature about your selected town or city. Here's some examples:

Start by deciding where your island is located. Then, decide on its size. What shape will it be?

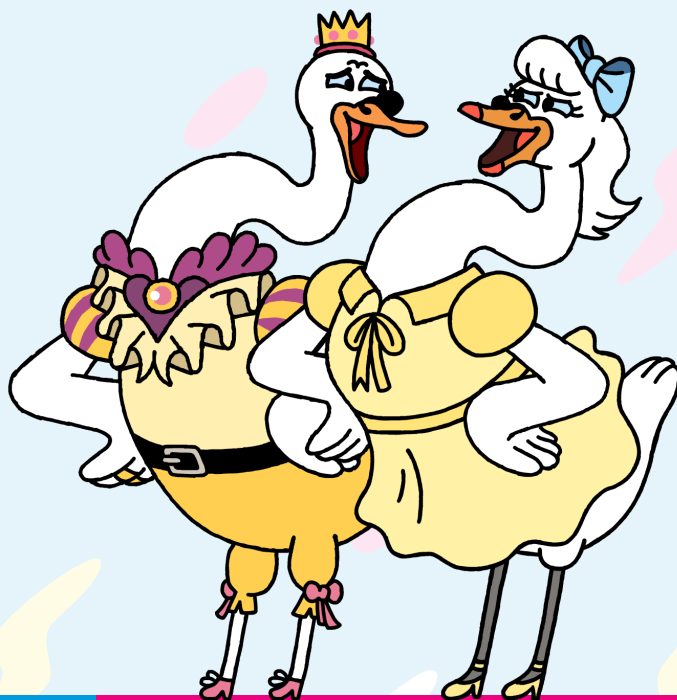
Now start to consider the details; will you include, for example:

### LESSON 5:

#### IT'S THE HEROIC QUEST OF THE VALIANT PRINCE IVANDOE COMPETITION!

#### THE CHALLENGE

Create your own fantastic, incredible and fabulous creature for Prince Ivandoe and Bert to meet!

It's all about your imagination.

The challenge is a tough one; Prince Ivandoe and Bert are already familiar with many strange beings. Take Princess Syllabob, for example - she's partly a shrimp, partly an axolotl and also an anglerfish. And she wears a pink tutu and green crown!

There are plenty of other similarly exotic, weird and wonderful creatures that they've encountered. So, you're going to have to create something quite spectacular. If you stretch your imagination and your creative skills to the limit, you can do it!

Read on to find out exactly what you need to do to be in with a chance of winning the most fantastic prize that money can't buy.

### THE DETAILS

Once you've sketched out a rough idea of the creature you've dreamed up, you should:

- Draw the creature showing in detail its amazing appearance, including plumage, the colour of its eyes (and where the eyes are located) etc.
- Think of other aspects of its appearance; does it have long hairy arms with long, sharp talons? And what size is it? Does it tower above you or might it be tiny and fairy-like?
- Does it have superpowers such as the ability to see for hundreds of miles?
- Consider how it communicates: maybe it emits a deafening shriek or a howl, or a friendly, cat-like purring noise (but extremely loud).
- Are there any surprising characteristics (it might breathe fire or hypnotise people with its dark green rotating eyes.)

These are suggestions; you're free to create whatever fantastic creature you wish!

Make sure you label your drawing clearly to pick out its astonishing features.

The winning entry will be a brilliant combination of artwork, original ideas and good presentation.
